

Year 2 Rouse Hill Farm Excursion:

Last Friday, Year 2 students enjoyed a day at Rouse Hill Farm and House. The sun was shining, which allowed for a great day of fun, learning and exploration outdoors. The students had the opportunity to experience life in the 1880s.

Students participated in a diverse program of exhibitions, research and events such as walks, talks and tours so they could experience life in the past as if they had lived it themselves.

Some of the many learning activities students participated in included; feeding the chickens, milking a 'pretend' cow, hanging out washing, brushing a saddle, learning how to pump and carry water as well as working as a team to move bags of hay!

Students participated in a school house tour where they learnt about school life in the 1880s. Students learnt to salute the flag, participated in an outdoor drill lesson that consisted of marching and maypole dancing. Students were students in the school house and participated in a sewing lesson and classroom lesson on the life cycle of a silk worm.

Notes from the February General Meeting


- Kings Langley Lions Club assisted in running the BBQ at our Performance Night last December. In gratitude of their services the P&C donated a cheque for \$300.

Fundraising Efforts



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Occupational Therapy at Parklea Primary School

What is Occupational Therapy?

Occupational Therapists (OT's) are one of a team of professionals who work in schools to help enable children to learn to the best of their ability.

OT's support children in the following areas:

Regulation - Overreaction or withdrawal from sensory input such as touch or movement. Unpredictable behaviour, restless or fussy.

Attention and concentration -Always on the move, short attention span, constantly fidgeting or impulsive. Challenges with organisational skills.

Gross motor skills - this includes being able to participate in sport, core strength, balance, ball skills and coordination. Fine motor skills - including hand strength, dexterity and manipulation skills.

Classroom skills - includes skills such as using scissors, drawing a recogniseable picture, remembering letters and numbers, copying from the board.

Handwriting - including pencil grasp, writing legibility, speed and endurance.

Self (are skills - looking after belongings, managing fastenings such as buttons and overall independence.

Play and social skills - playing cooperatively, coming up with good play ideas and making friends.

How to Make a Referral?

Nicole Patterson, one of our experienced Occupational Therapists is at Parklea Public once a fortnight during the school term. Students usually start with an initial assessment to work out what might be contributing to the challenges they are experiencing in the classroom and/or at home.

We then use an integrated approach to work closely with the student, their family, teacher and other professionals to offer a holistic and current approach to occupational therapy treatment. Treatment at school can be individual or in small groups, depending what would be the best fit for the student.

If you would like your child to see an OT, please discuss your concerns with your child's teacher then ring us directly to make a referral.
